with a tear. There is a radial tear in the posterior horn of the lateral meniscus. Increase signal intensity seen in the laloral meniscus is consistent meniscal degeneration. There irregularity of the patellar articulating surface with subchondral cystic changes, and cartilaginous loss, degenerative in nature. The periarticular soft tissue structures are normal.

Impression:

Posterior horn medial meniscal tear, likely degenerative in nature.

Radial tear. Posterior horn lateral meniscus, likely degenerative as well.

Intrasubstance tear, posterior cruciate ligament, likely chronic.

Degenerative changes about the patellofemoral compartment.

Moderate joint effusion, either inflammatory or posttraumatic. Also seen is a popliteal fossa cyst.
